The competition is open to undergraduate, honours and postgraduate students and early career researchers. Essays should be under 5000 words, and may be from any area of the Humanities, Social Sciences, Education and Law, including and not limited to: Indigenous and Native American Studies, Asian Australian and Asian American Studies, Race and Ethnic Studies, History and Historiography, Museum Studies, Tourism and Heritage Studies, Post-colonial Studies, Literary Studies and Comparative Literature, Cultural Studies, Media and Communication Studies, Psychology, Sociology, Boundary Studies, Anthropology, Women's Studies, Gender Studies, Queer Studies, Social Theory, Political Science, Legal Studies, Drama and Performing Arts, Visual and Design Studies.

The winning essays will show an awareness of scholarly work in the fields of critical race and whiteness studies. Prospective entrants are encouraged to consult the ACRAWSA e-journal for an indication of themes, concerns and contemporary issues addressed by scholars within the field. Essays including a focus on Indigenous sovereignty are encouraged.

Entrants must be members of ACRAWSA, or join at the time of entry.

(Undergraduate and Honours students need not be members, but if they win will be given a membership and the cost (\$25) deducted from their winnings.)

Deadline for submission: 30 April 2010.

To enter:

- Entry is free (aside from membership fees for non-members)
- Email your essay as an attachment to publicityofficer@acrawsa.org.au.
- Also attach a completed **entry form** (see reverse of this page or download from www.acrawsa.org.au)
- Please ensure you have removed all author-identifying details from the text of the essay
- Non-members may join at the time of entry by including a membership form and payment with their entry (download from www.acrawsa.org.au)

Fine print: Essays must be unpublished and not under consideration by any other journal. Prize winners who wish their essay published as a refereed article may request blind refereeing after the competition. Winners will be notified and announced on the ACRAWSA website in June 2010. The judging panel reserves the right not to award any prize if entries are not of sufficient quality.
